Regular Meeting 9/10/07

A regular meeting of the Redford Union Board of Education was held September 10, 2007, in the John C. Raeside Administration Building, 18499 Beech Daly Road, Redford Township, Michigan. President Pytel called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

President Pytel spoke to:

- Welcome students, parents, administration, support staff, teachers and board members to the 2007-2008 school year.
- The President referred to the article in the paper about a possible state shut down of services due to the 1.8 billion loss of funds with the elimination of the business tax. Education is the biggest part of the state budget. This makes the 4th Wednesday of the month, student count day, extremely important to the district for funding.

Superintendent Rhodes spoke to:

- Bulman and Stukey's curriculum nights are September 11, 2007,
 Hilbert's has been changed from September 11, 2007 to September 13, 2007.
- A very successful Freshman Focus orientation meeting was held on Wednesday, September 5, 2007. The 2006 orientation meeting had about 20 people, this years orientation meeting filled the auditorium and was overflowing. Very pleased with the community support of the program and very excited to see the changes and the results in our students. During the education portion of the agenda tonight Mrs. Moran and Mr. Evans will go over the power point presentation used at the Freshman Focus so the board and the audience can see it. There was a positive article in the Observer this weekend and one forthcoming in the Detroit News in the coming weeks. Pleased with press that the district is getting.
- All of the Elementary and the Middle school made AYP and all of the sub groups made AYP. Very pleased as the district has struggled with the special education sub group not making AYP in Math in the past and has been a challenge at the middle school and high school. We still have some obvious places to grow as far as the letter grade and continue to work on those this year.

- Χ. Presentations Special Reports Mr. Hanley, principal of Stuckey, spoke about the 2007 Michigan Tar
- Wars Poster Contest sponsored by the Oakland Family Residency Program and the Oakwood Foundation. This is a nationwide contest. A fifth grade student from last year was the first place state winner. The student won an all expense paid trip to Washington D.C.
- Pam Wheeler, teacher at Bullman, spoke about the China Exchange Art Project sponsored by the Michigan State Extension Services and 4H of Michigan. The teacher was provided a kit which included lesson plans in social studies and art on the culture of China. The art work of a fifth grade student from last year was selected by Michigan State University to go to Beijing, China where it will be passed and shared with school children in China.
- Jennifer Pakkula and Natalie LaFave did a presentation on the implementation of the ChemCom curriculum that was piloted last year. With recent changes in science requirements by the state for student graduation it was felt that a class needed to be offered that was rigorous, relevant and had relationship value to students. XII. Board of Education Communication/Discu ssion

Caloia distributed and spoke to the handout from the Michigan Department of Education on Free Textbooks, Materials and the Charging of Fees (page 8 of 14): which states "If a specific color, style and manufacturer is required by the school district, then the school district must supply the item free of charge." Caloia stated that the district is not responsible to pay for clothing if available at different stores.

A. Dress Code

<u>MOVED</u> by Caloia, seconded by Wujcik to implement school uniforms for the 2008-2009 school year with the colors to be worked out at a later date.

Gubachy states that she believes there needs to be a special meeting on the topic of school uniforms for input from the residents and students.

(Brenner would like to see the school uniform policy in writing prior to a vote or a special meeting.)

<u>MOVED</u> by Gubachy, seconded by Pytel to table the motion and discussion of the school dress code/uniform. Isabell – Yes, Brenner – Yes, Caloia – No, Wujcik – No, Pytel – Yes, Gubachy – Yes. Four/Two vote to table.

A special meeting was set for Monday, September 17, 2007 at 6:30 p.m. at the John C. Raeside Administration Building, 18499 Beech Daly Road, Redford, MI 48240 for community input. Caloia wanted it to be noted that school dress code/uniforms will be put on the agenda for a vote at the October meeting.

Brenner informed the board that more information has been received from Kroger regarding the gift card program. There is a 40 card minimum with a \$5.00 minimum loading to initiate the program. The district will receive 5% rebate on all amounts loaded once it reaches \$5000. Caloia questioned how they would be distributed and if they were reloadable.

The Superintendent apologized and informed the audience that Shift Happens and Freshman Focus presentations from the Educational Services section of the agenda will have to be postponed due to technical difficulty and will be presented at the October board meeting.

Brenner referred to the information in the board packet regarding the student representative and asked the board's permission to meet with the high school principal to further discuss the process of selecting a student

board member. Brenner was granted that approval to move forward.

At the call to the audience if there are any questions of comments regarding class size or teaching staff that we have not addressed, after knowing there was 188 students enrolled the last week before school, she will be happy to answer those.

Superintendent Comment

The President brought up the student incentives presented by other districts to bring students to school on student count day such as raffles or treats. Caloia agreed that it was a good idea. Gubachy stated that there is actually a 10 day grace period where a student, not at school on the count day, is later counted. Past years there have been food vendors, for the district, that have donated bikes to be raffled off.

President Comment

Tsvetanoff commented that the 2006 – 2007 fiscal audit has now been completed. The higher ups at Plante Moran are reviewing it and it is hoped that the results of the audit will be presented at the October regular board meeting. It is anticipated that if the audit goes as expected there will be a slightly smaller than predicted deficit.

XIV. Director of Finance
Communication

Charles Wilson, 19358 Lennane, father of two students of Redford Union and previous graduate of Redford Union. Feels that parents were not aware of the new cell phone policy and that a under age student signing the policy is not legitimate. Threatens legal action if the phone is not returned.

XV. Call to the Audience

Eric Leach, 17747 Fenton, and Jerry Allen, 15580 Denby, both seniors at Redford Union High School spoke regarding the Auto shop program at Redford Union High School. The current teacher is not certified for hands on training and with acceptance into a trade school for Auto mechanics upon graduation it is important that a certified teacher teaches the class. The Superintendent assured the students that the issue will be resolved and a certified teacher with Vocational training would be found to teach the class as soon as possible.

Lisa Santti, 17706 Centralia, spoke regarding the dress code. The family was gone a lot during the summer and had no idea there was discussion about implementing a district dress code. Ms. Santti also believes student representation is a good ides.

Marie Gazley, 18227 Indian asked the board why parents are not able to write checks for school fees. The Superintendent informed the audience that there have been numerous bounced checks and with the drastic reduction of the secretarial staff there is not enough time to pursue those parents that do write the checks to the district. Alternate payment methods and third party collections are being looked into. Ms. Gazley also spoke on the dress code issue and feels that an imposed dress code will not change the way kids act in school.

Georgiann Allen, 15580 Denby, commended the board for allowing public Regular Board Meeting: 9/10/07

input regarding the dress code. Ms. Allen referred to the closing of schools and how the community felt they were heard and listened too.

Andy Christopherson, teacher in the district and resident, struggled with if he should speak at the meeting. Redford Union High School has lost 20 teachers over the last eight years. Mr. Christopherson spoke on the open meeting act and stated that before an employer can declare impasse it has to vote on it in an open meeting or vote to give its negotiation team the right to declare impasse in an open meeting. If the board is to impose a contract the board has to vote on it in an open meeting. Mr. Christopherson states that reading over the minutes does not reveal that the board did any of those things. If this did take place then there is an unlawful impasse and an unlawful imposed contract.

MOVED by Isabell, seconded by Caloia to move to a closed session at 8:55 p.m. Roll call vote taken: Brenner – Yes, Caloia – Yes, Gubachy – Yes, Isabell – Yes, Pytel – Yes, Wujcik – Yes. Vote total of six Yes. Motion carried.
