Beech Elementary School:

Hilbert Elementary School:

Congratulations to Ms. Chartier's Sixth Grade Class. Several of our classrooms took part in the Read Bowl during January and February. READBowl is a worldwide reading competition where teams from PreK to 12th grade compete to log the most reading minutes. The event kicks off the week before the American College Football National Championship (the second Monday in January) and reaches its climax with a live crowning ceremony for the World Champions of Reading on Super Bowl Sunday morning. Ms. Chartier's sixth-grade class emerged as the State Champions in the Michigan Middle School Division, achieving the highest reading minutes in our state for their category.

New Classroom Library. Congratulations to Shayna Swinson, the 2024-25 recipient of the GVSU Michigan Literacy Project Classroom Library! This initiative was made possible by two faculty members from the College of Education and Community Innovation at Grand Valley State University, who oversee the Michigan Literacy Project. This non-profit organization provides classroom libraries to recent GVSU graduates teaching in underserved public-school districts across Michigan. As an alumna, Shayna submitted a compelling outline in her application, emphasizing the need for high-quality, engaging children's literature. This grant was facilitated through a partnership with Storehouse of Community Resources in Grand Rapids. Last Friday, Shayna traveled to Grand Rapids to choose books for her classroom library!

Attendance Initiatives for February. During February, we observed a rise in the number of students who missed two or fewer days of school. This month, we proudly awarded certificates to 283 students. The third-grade classes achieved an impressive attendance rate of 89.9%, while the sixth-grade students followed closely at 85.8%. Congratulations to all these dedicated students!

Redford Union Junior High School:

At the junior high school, we continue to build collaboration and education students academically, socially, and emotionally. One way that we are striving for teamwork and a healthy sense of competition is through our new house system. We are using the Ron Clark Academy model with the four houses of Reveur, Amistad, Isibindi and Altruismo. On Monday, February 10th we had our sorting assembly. All 7th and 8th grade students were sorted into their house and received a t-shirt that they will wear for house events. The staff in those houses welcomed them and we all had a great

time. Our house leaders will hold bi-weekly house meetings, and the houses will participate in house led events and competitions. The excitement over this can be felt throughout the building among both students and staff. To properly celebrate Black History month the junior high held its now annual Black History Month Celebration on Friday, February 28th. There was a guest speaker, student presenters and a special guest performers who drummed and danced. They brought the students down to participate as well. The committee put on another wonderful event for our school committee and are already planning for our event next year where we hope to involve the Divine 9 for presentations and step shows.

Our students continue to shine both inside and outside of the classroom. Mr. Behen worked extensively with a group of our Advanced 8th grade students to compete on March 1st at the Detroit Historical Museum in a Michigan History Day competition. While all our students made us proud, students Marino Jones, Lillian Cuff, Michael Lacey, and Mason Robinson advanced to the state finals! They will compete at Ferris State University and have a chance of competing in Maryland at the National History Day finals.

Redford Union High School:

Redford Union School District is proud to announce our partnership with Lawrence Technological University, starting fall 2025. This collaboration will provide college & career readiness programming for all Redford Union students, including opportunities to earn dual enrollment credits. Together, we are building pathways to success!

Ten RUHS band students were accepted and traveled to Wayne State University to participate in the WSU Honors Band Day. Over 200 students applied from high schools across Michigan to participate in this event. Our musicians rehearsed college-level music all day to prepare for a concert later that evening. Our musicians were able to build new friendships and work with college professors and students.

Congratulations to our Lady Panthers varsity basketball team, which captured their first District Championship since 2017 Friday night, with a 42-27 victory over Detroit Lincoln King! With the win, the Lady Panthers improve to 3–0 in the state playoffs and will compete for the Regional Championship beginning this Monday at Detroit Edison HS (opponent Ferndale High School). Redford Union is coached by RUHS alumna Courtney Gagnon.
