Summer Discovery & Credit Recovery Program(s):

Summer Discovery & Credit Recovery Program(s):

The high school, 10th and 11th graders had a total of 186 courses that were registered and 178 of them passed. The courses that were not passed were from three students and two of them ended up with tasks to make up some credits. Those students are already on their way. They had a 95% pass rate.

The percentages of the pass rates for 10th and 11th grades were shared with the Board.

Ninth grade students attended the summer program for credit recovery. They had 28 students enrolled with 53 of 54 credits recovered, which was a 98.2% pass rate. They had 100% pass rate in English, Biology and World History. In Algebra they had 18 out of 19 credits recovered.

The number of credits passed per subject was shared with the Board.

The 7th and 8th grade summer program was held at MacGowan. Due to low attendance, they had 8 students that participated in the Rising 9th Grade. The percentage for the pre and post tests increased from 0 proficient to 12. Ninth graders attended the summer program for the credit recovery program.

The pre and post test results for 7th and 8th grades were shared with the Board.

There were questions and answers.

Next year, the 6th graders will join the junior high summer program.

Trustee Bailey requested the number of students that failed, per grade level for both the junior high and high school.

It was stated that the requested information would be brought back to the Board at a future meeting.

For grades 1st through 7th a total of 175 students were enrolled in the summer program. They had a total averaged 80.4% in attendance. They had a lot of incentives, and the students had to hit three out of four days in order to get the incentive on Thursdays, and they needed to get 70% attendance in order to attend the program. At the end of the program, they took 113 students to the Tiger's baseball game.

The pre and post assessments and growth were shared with the Board.

Staff introduced themselves and shared their experiences from visiting the Ron Clark Academy in Atlanta, GA. They also shared some of the goals and initiatives they have started in their classrooms and buildings this school year.

They spoke on one of the biggest changes in their classrooms, which was the stages and sound systems. It gives lessons extra energy and grabs students' attention. Students want to share; they want to be on stage.

They explained the integration of the essential 55 expectations from RCA with the PBIS system. They shared the success of the house system at Hilbert, including increased student engagement and mentorship opportunities. And they announced the expansion of the house system to include all grade levels at Hilbert.

There were questions and answers.

Trustee Bailey requested pictures of the stages and sound systems.

Trustee Bailey requested that the Board have access to the Essential 55 book and the Be 1% Better book at the Board Office (Keeler).

Superintendent Witt gave kudos to all the staff members who spent their own time attending the RCA event.

Superintendent Witt acknowledged the support from Huntington Bank and the Ballmer Group in funding the RCA experience.

Superintendent Witt will get the Board photos of those stages in use and the sound systems in use, and some videos of those as well. Currently we have five stages in use and in place with sound systems at the junior high. and there are seven in place at Hilbert. The 12 stages and sound systems were donated through a generous donation of \$30,000 to the district from the Maibach Family Foundation.

He mentioned the future expansion of the house system to include all grade levels at Hilbert. We are also launching the house system for grades four through six at Beech Elementary for the coming year. Eventually, those groups will move into the high school and will already be in houses.

President Pridemore expressed gratitude for the generous support from donors and the positive impact on the school community.
